P R O C E E D I N G S

[2] CHAIRMAN DAVIS: Good afternoon, ladies and
 [3] gentlemen, and welcome to our St. Augustine-St.
 [4] Johns County Airport Authority organizational
 [5] meeting for January the 2nd, 2001, and a very
 [6] happy new year to all of you.
 [7] This meeting is mandated by our charter. It
 [8] is our special meeting for organization to
 [9] install new members that were recently elected
 [10] and to also organize the board for the upcoming
 [11] year. That board will be electing their
 [12] secretary/treasurer, who will also serve as their
 [13] vice-chair and their chairman.
 [14] I call this meeting to order. And our final
 [15] comments on the first order will be from the
 [16] outgoing members. Mr. Taylor, you have the
 [17] floor.
 [18] FINAL COMMENTS FROM BOARD MEMBERS
 [19] MR. TAYLOR: You told me I'd have to wing
 [20] it. That's not much notice for winging it. I've
 [21] felt well-treated. I'm amazed at how rapidly
 [22] four years have gone by. I have to say I hope
 [23] I've been some part of the environment and
 [24] atmosphere of being very cooperative and
 [25] productive, as I believe it is. And we have a

[1] wonderful staff. It's been quite an experience
 [2] and something I'll cherish. I can't say I
 [3] enjoyed every minute, but I think that it's been
 [4] very positive. Thank you.
 [5] CHAIRMAN DAVIS: Thank you, Mr. Taylor.
 [6] First of all, to the staff of this airport, I
 [7] have to say thank you. It has been a good four
 [8] years. You have given us the information that we
 [9] needed to make this board a business board. You
 [10] have been there when we had questions. You
 [11] stayed there when we disagreed.
 [12] Four years ago, I said that I had one
 [13] mandate that I wanted on this board, and I have
 [14] to say that it was done, that all five members on
 [15] this board have a right to agree to disagree
 [16] without being disagreeable, and we have done that
 [17] through two boards.
 [18] I've had the opportunity of serving as the
 [19] secretary/treasurer for one year and the chairman
 [20] for two. To the people of this county, I can say
 [21] that I made you a promise that we would make this
 [22] airport into a business; we have tried to do
 [23] that. That we would put it on a roadway to
 [24] independence; the board has done that. Not me,
 [25] the board. If my guidance and patience with them

[1] has added to that, then I'm thankful for that.
 [2] You as the public have been there. One
 [3] other thing I said, you may not always agree with
 [4] what I do, or you may not always agree with what
 [5] this board does, but you'll always know why. And
 [6] we have tried to give you that.
 [7] I must add a personal note to this, to my
 [8] wife Betty. You've been there with me when we
 [9] had other things to do, but the airport came
 [10] first, and I've always tried to do that. And I
 [11] thank you from the bottom of my heart.
 [12] To the sitting members that are here, just
 [13] keep the work going. Trust your staff; they will
 [14] always guide you in the right way, and not to
 [15] agree with them all the time, but they will
 [16] always tell you what you want to know. That's
 [17] what we hired them for, and that's what they do
 [18] for us.
 [19] To our new members that are coming on, the
 [20] only thing I can say is keep up the good work.
 [21] We've tried to guide it in a direction that will
 [22] help this county. If you maintain that in your
 [23] mind, that this is a whole county, we're not in
 [24] districts, we're in the whole county, what is
 [25] good for the whole county and what is good for

[1] member who is also either an employee of the
 [2] State of Florida, the County of St. Johns, or the
 [3] City of St. Augustine, that that issue –
 [4] constitutionality of that issue is in debate.
 [5] We were not going to have a final resolution
 [6] on that decision by today, and at the last
 [7] meeting, there was some anxiety expressed by the
 [8] board members about whether there were concerns
 [9] about that, which caused us to go back and think
 [10] more carefully about it.
 [11] And what in particular concerned us was the
 [12] potential that if someone took office and
 [13] subsequently was determined not to be qualified,
 [14] and that our charter, as it reads, is valid, that
 [15] someone could challenge the validity of our
 [16] decisions, particularly any decisions that were
 [17] made by a 3-to-2 vote with the membership in
 [18] question in the majority.
 [19] We do a lot of things. As you know, bid
 [20] disputes are not uncommon in this world,
 [21] particularly in the dollar amounts that we deal
 [22] with. And so, after more thought, we
 [23] investigated further and filed a motion with the
 [24] Court for an injunction.
 [25] An injunction is the entry of an order, in

[1] this airport.
 [2] If you keep personal vendettas out of it,
 [3] you will always be right. You won't have
 [4] anywhere to go except forward. You have to do
 [5] it. Sometimes you don't agree with what you have
 [6] to do, but for the whole of the county, for the
 [7] whole of this airport, for the whole of this
 [8] board, always maintain that thought in your mind
 [9] and you'll never go wrong.
 [10] I thank all of you, the board members,
 [11] staff, and the county for the pleasure of being
 [12] on this board for the last four years. Thank
 [13] you.
 [14] We have one order that has to be done prior
 [15] to the installation of our new officers on this
 [16] board. George?
 [17] **GEORGE McCLURE - CHARTER RESTRICTIONS**
 [18] **MR. McCLURE:** I asked for an opportunity to
 [19] address the board real quickly on the matter that
 [20] we discussed at the last general meeting, and
 [21] that was the issue of the restrictions of our
 [22] charter as to membership on the board.
 [23] You'll recall that there is a pending issue,
 [24] which is whether or not the portion of our
 [25] charter which prohibits someone from serving as a

[1] this case on a temporary basis, which prohibits
 [2] certain things from happening. And our argument
 [3] was that whatever the outcome, that our charter
 [4] as it stands should be presumed to be valid and
 [5] should be followed until and unless a Judge tells
 [6] us that it's not valid, and that there could be
 [7] harm that would result if a member is
 [8] subsequently determined to be unqualified was
 [9] seated.
 [10] And we had a hearing this afternoon at 1:30
 [11] before Judge Mathis. Judge Mathis did two
 [12] things, I think, one of which the parties would
 [13] disagree on, and one of which I think the parties
 [14] do agree on is a good thing.
 [15] The thing that we would disagree on perhaps
 [16] is that Judge Mathis granted our motion and
 [17] enjoined Ms. Bosanko from taking the oath of
 [18] office today and sitting as a member to make
 [19] decisions on this body today.
 [20] It's not a ruling on the merits of the case.
 [21] It doesn't say as a final matter that – that the
 [22] charter is valid or invalid. It just says that
 [23] while the issue is under dispute – in dispute,
 [24] we should not further complicate things by
 [25] seating a member with a cloud existing.

[1] The second thing that was done, which I
 [2] think we're both appreciative of, both sides of
 [3] this debate, is that he has set an accelerated
 [4] date for the determination of this matter, and
 [5] this matter will be decided on January 16th,
 [6] which is two weeks from today.
 [7] And that is before any other meeting that we
 [8] have. And out of a desire to -- to make sure
 [9] that things aren't interrupted regardless of the
 [10] result, we have agreed to provide Ms. Bosanko
 [11] with complete agenda packets and keep her
 [12] informed, as any board member would be, of things
 [13] that are coming up so if -- if it comes out that
 [14] there's a problem with our charter, she can hit
 [15] the ground running. And, hopefully, other than
 [16] the meeting that we have today, there won't be
 [17] any other one at which there is any anxiety or
 [18] any uncertainty about what the outcome would be.
 [19] So, what we're doing today is administering
 [20] the oath of office to Mr. Ciriello, who has
 [21] received his commission to take office. And we
 [22] will have a four-member board, which is valid
 [23] under the rules and statutes of the State of
 [24] Florida, and the actions of the board will be, as
 [25] long as there's a quorum and a majority vote,

 [2] **INSTALLATION OF NEW BOARD MEMBERS**
 [3] MR. ROSE: All right. Installation of the
 [4] new board members. Mr. Ciriello says this is the
 [5] only time he's going to wear a coat and tie.
 [6] MR. McCLURE: Are you Joseph Ciriello?
 [7] MR. CIRIELLO: Yes, I am.
 [8] MR. McCLURE: Mr. Ciriello, I'd like you to
 [9] repeat after me. This is a prescribed oath under
 [10] the laws of the State of Florida. If you'd raise
 [11] your right hand, sir.
 [12] (Whereupon, the oath was administered to Joe
 [13] Ciriello.)
 [14] MR. McCLURE: Congratulations.
 [15] MR. CIRIELLO: Thank you.
 [16] MR. ROSE: Come on up.
 [17] MR. CIRIELLO: I guess I can come on up here
 [18] and start throwing tomatoes.
 [19] MR. ROSE: Well, congratulations and
 [20] welcome.
 [21] MR. CIRIELLO: Thank you. Do I take your
 [22] seat or --
 [23] MR. ROSE: Just pick one that you like.
 [24] MR. CIRIELLO: The one with wheels.
 [25] 4.B. - ELECTION OF SECRETARY/TREASURER

[1] will be final and binding. And then come January
 [2] 16th, we'll have an answer to our question.
 [3] CHAIRMAN DAVIS: Thank you, Mr. McClure.
 [4] One other item before I turn this over to someone
 [5] else. Is there any comment to be made by the
 [6] present sitting members? Mr. Rose?
 [7] MR. ROSE: I have none.
 [8] CHAIRMAN DAVIS: Mr. Lassiter?
 [9] MR. LASSITER: I have none.
 [10] CHAIRMAN DAVIS: Mr. Watts?
 [11] MR. WATTS: None.
 [12] CHAIRMAN DAVIS: If not, Mr. Rose, as
 [13] Chairman of this board going out, and as you
 [14] being vice-chairman, until you elect your
 [15] officers, which is your secretary/treasurer
 [16] first, and then your chairman, I turn this
 [17] meeting over to you.
 [18] Mr. Taylor, you may leave also.
 [19] MR. ROSE: Do you have to change seats to do
 [20] this?
 [21] All right. We're on item 4 on the agenda,
 [22] election of officers. And I will --
 [23] MR. LASSITER: No, we have to do 3 first.
 [24] MR. McCLURE: We have to do number 3.
 [25] MR. ROSE: Oh, the installation of the new

 [24] MR. ROSE: Congratulations.
 [25] 4.A. - ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN

[1] MR. ROSE: Okay. I'll now receive
 [2] nominations for the position of Chairman of the
 [3] Authority for --
 [4] MR. CIRIELLO: Mr. Chairman --
 [5] MR. ROSE: -- the year 2001. Yes, sir.
 [6] MR. CIRIELLO: I would like to nominate
 [7] Mr. Rose as our Chairman for the coming year.
 [8] MR. LASSITER: I'll second.
 [9] MR. ROSE: Is there any further discussion?
 [10] (No discussion.)
 [11] MR. ROSE: All in favor, say aye.
 [12] MR. LASSITER: Aye.
 [13] MR. WATTS: Aye.
 [14] MR. CIRIELLO: Aye.
 [15] MR. ROSE: Opposed?
 [16] (No opposition.)
 [17] MR. ROSE: There's no opposition, so I will
 [18] serve as Chairman. Thank you, gentlemen. It's
 [19] going to be a pleasure to work with you.
 [20] 4.C. - PLAQUE AWARDS
 [21] CHAIRMAN ROSE: Now, I'd like to take just a
 [22] minute and deviate from the agenda. And I want
 [23] to ask Joe Taylor -- where is Joe? Come up here,
 [24] Joe. And I want Betty and Carl Davis to come up.
 [25] Why don't you just come right up here.

[1] give him today. So, I'll begin. Carl, here is
 [2] the plaque presented to you in appreciation for
 [3] your services as a board member and Chairman.
 [4] And there is your plaque.
 [5] MR. DAVIS: Thank you.
 [6] CHAIRMAN ROSE: Congratulations. And Joe
 [7] Taylor, here is your plaque.
 [8] MR. TAYLOR: Thank you very much.
 [9] CHAIRMAN ROSE: Congratulations and thank
 [10] you so much from the members of this Authority.
 [11] Betty, take good care of that guy now.
 [12] All right. We have an action item, so I'll
 [13] turn this over to Mr. Wuellner.
 [14] 5.A - BID AWARD - TERMINAL EXPANSION
 [15] MR. WUELLNER: Pay attention, right? At the
 [16] last Authority meeting, we had an item of
 [17] business that was left unresolved and was kind of
 [18] turned over to staff and the airport attorneys to
 [19] work out where we needed to be and what we could
 [20] and couldn't do as it surrounded bids for the
 [21] terminal project.
 [22] I'm pleased to announce that we have finally
 [23] come to a determination of what we can and can't
 [24] do and, as such, the construction of the bid
 [25] documents provided that the award would be made

[1] You know, I don't know what the protocol is,
 [2] so I'm just kind of, you know, going ahead with
 [3] sheer awkwardness and determination, and we'll
 [4] get it done.
 [5] But first, I want to tell Carl and I want to
 [6] tell Joe that I think I speak for the entire
 [7] board and for the staff that have been working
 [8] with you over the past years, that it's been a
 [9] pleasure to have you with us.
 [10] And, Carl, you've guided us and kept us on
 [11] an even keel and tried to make everybody pay
 [12] attention to their duties, and we appreciate it.
 [13] You've done a good job, and I think the Airport
 [14] Authority is thankful that you've been able to do
 [15] that, and we appreciate it.
 [16] Joe, you've been a steady hand, and it's
 [17] been good to have you on the board the last four
 [18] years. And I know that it's important to you how
 [19] this -- how this board works, and we're going to
 [20] try and keep it going like you and Carl have --
 [21] have set the example for us in the past.
 [22] And, Betty, I wanted you up here, because I
 [23] remember when -- when Carl took office, you were
 [24] here to officiate at his installation, and I
 [25] think you ought to share the recognition that we

[1] on the lowest total bid for the project. That
 [2] was both phases combined. That appeared to be
 [3] legitimate and was indeed the terms that the
 [4] solicitation was made under.
 [5] There was nothing that could be found that
 [6] precluded the Airport Authority from negotiating
 [7] that Phase 1 into something that was more in
 [8] align with the bid received for Phase 1; that is,
 [9] that the total dollars could be more aligned with
 [10] what the -- we had received as a low bid, if you
 [11] will, just to look at Phase 1.
 [12] With that information, we have sat down with
 [13] Global Construction, who was the company that had
 [14] the lowest total bid; however, did not have the
 [15] lowest Phase 1 bid at that point, and have been
 [16] able to discuss with them and they have agreed to
 [17] take their Phase 1 bid down to the lowest bid
 [18] number that we had received, which was
 [19] \$1,950,000. They have agreed to enter into a
 [20] contract with the Airport Authority for that
 [21] amount, so they are -- that is consistent with
 [22] what we received in bids; plus, it's also
 [23] consistent with what was advertised.
 [24] Now, the total aggregate bid will still be,
 [25] I believe it was 2 point -- \$2,610,151. The

[1] total will not change; just simply how it's
 [2] apportioned between Phase 1 and Phase 2. So, I
 [3] want to make sure that everybody understands that
 [4] the total has not changed; just the first phase
 [5] amount or that being appropriated to Phase 1 has
 [6] changed and has been reduced to the lowest
 [7] number, which was the bid provided by RIC-LON
 [8] Enterprises of \$1,950,000.

[9] And subject to Florida DOT concurrence, it
 [10] would be Staff's recommendation that we enter
 [11] into a first-phase contract with Global
 [12] Construction in the amount of \$1,950,000 for
 [13] Phase 1, the terminal construction project.

[14] CHAIRMAN ROSE: Ed, do I understand that
 [15] the -- that Global ultimately will do both
 [16] phases?

[17] MR. WUELLNER: Correct, if they're both
 [18] awarded, they will do both phases.

[19] CHAIRMAN ROSE: And we're awarding Phase 1,
 [20] and we will award Phase 2 when the funding is --

[21] MR. WUELLNER: That is correct.

[22] CHAIRMAN ROSE: -- is in place.

[23] MR. WUELLNER: Yes, sir.

[24] CHAIRMAN ROSE: Any questions of
 [25] Mr. Wuellner?

 [2] CHAIRMAN ROSE: Is there any public comment?

[3] (No public comment.)

[4] CHAIRMAN ROSE: Any discussion from the
 [5] Board?

[19] MR. CIRIELLO: No.

[20] CHAIRMAN ROSE: No discussion. We're ready
 [21] for the vote. All of those in favor --

[22] MR. LASSITER: Aye.

[23] MR. WATTS: Aye.

[24] MR. CIRIELLO: Aye.

[25] CHAIRMAN ROSE: Aye.

[2] (No opposition.)

[3] CHAIRMAN ROSE: The motion has passed.

[4] MR. WUELLNER: Thank you, sir. That's the
 [5] only thing we had for you today.

[6] CHAIRMAN ROSE: Okay. We have no other
 [7] business. We're ready for comments from the
 [8] board members. As the new member, do you --
 [9] should you be first or last? I think we'll make
 [10] you first.

[11] COMMENTS FROM BOARD MEMBERS

[12] MR. CIRIELLO: Well, if you make me first,
 [13] the last guy might not get a chance. No, I -- I
 [14] have a two-part question that's related -- of
 [15] course, there's a lot of things on my mind, but
 [16] right now, I'd like to know the way that the
 [17] agendas are prepared, how that's done, and also,
 [18] if any special workshops for other board meetings
 [19] other than the scheduled one, how that would --
 [20] how you'd go about that, because I've got a
 [21] couple of projects in mind that I think is going
 [22] to take some workshops or extra meetings to
 [23] discuss and clarify.

[24] It's not one of these things where you can
 [25] come and read the agenda and discuss it for a

[1] couple of minutes and make a motion and pass it.
 [2] It's -- and I'd like to get these couple of items
 [3] out of the way. And I just want to know how you
 [4] go about that.

[5] CHAIRMAN ROSE: All right. I -- I have some
 [6] comments. I'm sure Ed Wuellner -- Ed, do you
 [7] want to go first or --

[8] MR. WUELLNER: I would just say you can
 [9] contact me directly and we can agenda it. If
 [10] it's something that we need to get -- typically,
 [11] I would formulate the agenda for you in the
 [12] absence of input from the Chairman.

[13] The Chairman has the opportunity to add any
 [14] items he wishes, and typically, the Chairman adds
 [15] items. If you have something you want added, you
 [16] know, if you bring it up at a board meeting or
 [17] bring it up through me, we can get it on the
 [18] agenda for you.

[19] MR. CIRIELLO: Well, what I'm getting at is
 [20] say like, well, not this next meeting for
 [21] January, but say between the third -- the meeting
 [22] in January and February, if something came up
 [23] that I thought should be on the agenda, I
 [24] couldn't go to the board member because I'd be
 [25] breaking the sunshine. Could I call you and say

[1] I would like to see this item added to the
 [2] agenda, and you could do that or --
 [3] MR. WUELLNER: Yes.
 [4] MR. CIRIELLO: Is that how that would work?
 [5] MR. WUELLNER: Yes, sir. Easy enough to do.
 [6] MR. CIRIELLO: For the meetings, I would
 [7] have to bring it up on board comments, and the
 [8] board would have to decide whether they'd want
 [9] the meetings or not.
 [10] MR. WUELLNER: Correct. I have no authority
 [11] to call a special meeting.
 [12] MR. CIRIELLO: Yeah, okay.
 [13] MR. WUELLNER: The Chairman would have
 [14] that --
 [15] MR. CIRIELLO: Okay.
 [16] CHAIRMAN ROSE: Joe, I think this: If an
 [17] item comes up and it was a part of the discussion
 [18] of the board meeting that requires a vote that
 [19] should be on the agenda, if it -- if it requires
 [20] any Staff work to get information together for us
 [21] to consider or if it requires a workshop or
 [22] whatever, I think as Chairman, I would recommend
 [23] then that that item not be voted on today, but be
 [24] placed on the agenda for next week so the staff
 [25] can do its homework and so we can have whatever

[1] workshop meetings we need to have before that.
 [2] MR. CIRIELLO: Yeah.
 [3] CHAIRMAN ROSE: And I think it's -- you're
 [4] right; there will be items that we have to have a
 [5] workshop meeting in order to -- in order to
 [6] discuss.
 [7] MR. WUELLNER: Just as a matter of
 [8] formality, too, just -- just remind you, I'm sure
 [9] you're aware of, but, you know, workshop meetings
 [10] are just that, you know --
 [11] MR. CIRIELLO: Yeah, you can't vote on them.
 [12] MR. WUELLNER: -- no action can be taken up.
 [13] CHAIRMAN ROSE: But we have to take minutes
 [14] and so forth.
 [15] MR. CIRIELLO: Yeah.
