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PROCEEDINGS
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Let's call the meeting of the St. Johns County-St. Augustine Airport Authority into session, and if we could have everybody rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.
(Pledge of Allegiance.)

## ELECTION OF OFFICERS

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Thank you. This special
meeting of the St. Augustine-St. Johns County Airport Authority will begin with the officer elections. Right now, I'd like to put forward chairman nominations, if we could put that forward. Okay. Buzz?

MR. GEORGE: I'd like to make a comment beforehand. You know, seven years ago, we started building a plan to get off the tax rolls, and it looks like it's going to happen.

Now, what that means is that next year and this year, it's going to take a different kind of financial analysis. You know, we've always had plans that say here's what it's going to cost us and it's $71 / 2$ percent return. But we don't have very good reporting back on the track record how did we do? Did we actually build it for that?

You know, are we getting that kind of revenue in?

And I'm thinking that for the financing for us to go forward to the future is going to be through relationships with banks, with industrial bonds and stuff like that, and in those cases, we're going to have to build a fairly tight
business plan, a business plan for each one of our projects, and in that business plan, we're going to need to be able to present what our accomplishments have been to give us the -- the solidification that we could get, you know, that financing and go forward.

So, as we get into the nominations, I'd like for you to keep in mind, it's my opinion that our chairman and our secretary-treasurer are going to be spending a lot more time this year in getting us planning so that we can take or this group can take the next step into the future. Okay.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay. Jim?
MR. WERTER: I was just going to pose a nomination, and in light of that, I think that Kelly should -- I'd like to nominate Kelly again, if she's willing to accept the nomination, to carry the flag.

She's been doing a good job this year. She
presents herself well. A leader is as good as the
information he or she is given and the support that she receives, he or she.

And with that, along with the -- the treasurer going forth as you put it, towards the banking industry --
(Mr. Burnett enters the room.)
MR. WERTER: -- or whoever we may need to aid us in that event, I'd like to nominate Kelly

Barrera to keep the position.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Thank you, Jim. Carl?
MR. YOUMAN: My nomination is the same as
last year, which was Kelly, and Kelly has done a fantastic job and -- and I see no reason to change whatsoever.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Thank you, Carl. Do we have any other nominations?

MR. GORMAN: Yes. I -- you have done a great job, Kelly, okay? Hands down, all right? But I'd like to nominate Mr. Werter, because I believe he'd be objective.

He's been here a year and he knows what's going on, he knows the ropes, and is a veteran of the courts and the judicial experience. He's an expert at being able to allow each board member an
ability for full discussion of views and values.

He has his year experience and he'd be good at it.
It's just his background and I think he'd be good.
So I'd like to nominate him, if he'd accept.
MR. GEORGE: Do you think that Jim, one year
as secretary-treasurer might add to his expertise?
MR. WERTER: I -- if I can address that, I -you know, and I appreciate how you feel about me, but it was my intent to make my desires known for that -- it did -- excuse me, still dripping here -- the additional year, and I was going to put myself forth, you know, for the treasurer for the budgeting experience and the accounting experience and people better in the know to back Kelly up on that one.

So, though I appreciate that -- the nomination, I'm going to decline at this point because I think I could use another year, but not as an EDC person, unless you decide to keep me as an EDC person, but, you know, something like the treasure -- treasurer position would be more suitable to prep me for something like that. You understand that.

MR. GORMAN: I understand. I just -- the background is what I wanted.

MR. WERTER: Oh, yeah, yeah. I appreciate

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your thoughts on that. Thank you.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay. Do we have any other further nominations for chairman?
(No further nominations.)
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay. Well, let's put it to a vote, then. All in favor of keeping me as chairman, say aye.

MR. GEORGE: Aye.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Aye.
MR. GORMAN: Aye.
MR. YOUMAN: Aye.
MR. WERTER: Aye.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Any opposed?
(No opposition.)
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay. Well, thank you all very much, and thank you for your kind words. Okay. Let's look at the secretary and treasurer nomination. Jim, you've put yourself forth as interested in doing that position?

MR. WERTER: I'll leave it to the board, whoever wants to nominate me. If they have someone different, please, I won't take insult.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Do we have any other nominations for the position?

MR. GORMAN: I would then nominate Mr. Werter
because he's being involved and he's volunteered and again, nothing like a volunteer. Especially for that -- especially for that situation.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay. Do we have anybody else that would like to put forward a nomination for treasurer, secretary-treasurer?
(No further nominations.)
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Hearing none, all in favor
of having Jim be our secretary-treasurer, say aye.
MR. GEORGE: Aye.
MR. GORMAN: Aye.
MR. YOUMAN: Aye.
MR. WERTER: Aye.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Aye. Jim.
MR. WERTER: Thank you.

## COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay. Let's move on to our committee assignments. Let's start with the TPO, the Transportation Planning Organization. Do we have anybody, any nominations for that position?

MR. GEORGE: I'd like to nominate Jack for that. Jack's been involved in it throughout the years and he's the primary backup and I know
you're traveling quite a bit right now -- or you
were traveling. But I think Jack would represent us very well on that.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay. We have Jack.
Jack, would you accept the nomination?
MR. GORMAN: I'll accept it with a caveat that we have to have a good second. We have to have a good backup on this thing, because --

MR. GEORGE: Well, would you prefer to stay as the backup?

MR. GORMAN: I think between two people, it needs to be covered between two people. It wouldn't matter whether I was the primary or the backup as long as we could cover it. I'd accept the primary, if you'd like.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay. So you're open for either the primary or the backup.

MR. GORMAN: Yes.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Do we have anybody else who -- any other nominations? Buzz?

MR. GEORGE: I think that Carl, you know, when he's here, he's on top of that stuff. So I think the dynamic duo that we have here have done a good job and, you know, why -- why change it?

MR. WERTER: His -- his experience with CSX
and what he's been doing the past year has been
phenomenal.
MR. GEORGE: Yeah.
MR. YOUMAN: I'd like to stay on it because as Denise said, the continuity is a major factor that's been lacking for the -- from the board authority, the change every year, and Jack and I have worked very well at it, I believe, and if you-all agree, I'd like it to stay the way it is.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: I agree with that. Do we have any other nominations before we discuss it any further?
(No further nominations.)
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay. Jack, both you and
Carl have been nominated. As far as the person
who's going to be the lead on this, I know that you don't have a preference. Carl, do you have a preference as to who's going to be the lead on this position?

MR. YOUMAN: I'd like to stay as the lead, if it's okay with Jack.

MR. GORMAN: That's fine.
MR. YOUMAN: If you have any --
MR. GORMAN: We'll just cover it.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay. Then we'll put it
to a vote. Everybody in favor of having Carl be
the lead and Jack be the second, please say aye.
MR. GEORGE: Aye.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Aye.
MR. GORMAN: Aye.
MR. YOUMAN: Aye.
MR. WERTER: Aye.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: And any opposed?
(No opposition.)
MR. YOUMAN: Thank you.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay. We'll keep that as
it is. Economic Development Council. Do we have any nominations to be our representative for the EDC?

MR. GEORGE: I nominate Kelly.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: I would decline the nomination, because if I'm going to act as chairman, I think that that is a -- is a role in and of itself that has to flow between the different committees. So I think that --

MR. GEORGE: Okay. My thought there was, you know, with the planning for next year and the following years there out, the Economic Development Council, they're the ones that are building the thrust.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: It is key, I agree with
you.
MR. GEORGE: If you're going to be the chairman, you know, that would be a little added emphasis for having you on that board, if you -if you want.

MR. BURNETT: Madam Chair, if I might -- if I might interject this, as a reminder to everyone, the EDC has now changed its format. It's no longer breakfast at Serenata. It's now lunch at Carrabba's. So, as far as scheduling, that makes a difference.

MR. GEORGE: I don't need to go to either one of them.

MR. WERTER: I have to say, I had an interest in either staying with EDC or the intergovernmental. The Carrabba's is down the block from my office, so you know, whatever you guys decide, but...

MR. YOUMAN: I was --
MR. WERTER: It's not really, pardon the expression, a work-intensive position. It isn't.

MR. GEORGE: Yeah.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: So we have -- we have Jim. Do we have any other nominations?

MR. GEORGE: So you're saying that my
nomination of you is out of place; is that
correct?
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: No, I kept -- I kept it,
but I'm thinking more of a second, a second person
on that EDC. I think that that might be --
MR. GEORGE: Well then, Jim being our secretary-treasurer and having done it before would be an ideal second.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: As opposed to a primary.
And you attend the meetings regularly?
MR. WERTER: Yeah.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Do we have -- is there any other nominations?

MR. WERTER: Well, I know Carl would be interested if they served bacon at lunch, but...

MR. YOUMAN: That's right. But they don't. But I'd still be your backup if you wish, if you need a backup.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay. Why don't we
have -- why don't we -- would -- in light of the conversation that you're starting, before we put it to a vote, the -- the way the committee is -the EDC is set up, it certainly I think as chairman, it -- I have attended them over the last
year and I -- not every one, but I certainly have
been to a couple of over the last year, at least three EDC meetings.

So why don't we let it continue to be or look at as the chairperson still attending them on a more regular basis and being more involved without
having the reporting responsibility back to our board.

MR. YOUMAN: The other side of the coin, I mean, is if Jim's going to be increased duties in a project manager's type situation along your lines of thinking on each project to set it up as, you know, if it's going to make a profit or are we within cost --

MR. GEORGE: Right.
MR. YOUMAN: -- that's going to increase his work. But still, in conjunction with the EDC, there seems to be a tie-in there, to me.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Certainly. Certainly. I think that was the point Buzz was trying to make earlier.

MR. WERTER: Logistically it wouldn't be a problem for me. Logistically.

MR. GEORGE: I just think that there's some mileage we can get out of having the chairman
there.

MR. WERTER: Sure.
MR. GEORGE: Because I think that in this economy that's going on, I anticipate the EDC really getting their act together and, you know, the more we can support them. But I didn't know that we had as a board decided that the chairman should not be, you know, in a --

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: No, that was my own personal. That was my own personal thing. But, you know, with saying that, I've been to the TPO meetings. I've been to the EDC meetings. I've been to the Aerospace Academy meetings.

I've been to -- I have not been to the intergovernmental meetings, but I have also sat in on the --

MR. GEORGE: I wanted to talk to you about that.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: I've sat in on some of the community meetings. So certainly, I would want
to -- I like -- I like -- I think it's important that the chairman is involved in -- in the different committees as a whole.

And I would certainly agree with you that this year, with the EDC -- and I will get with

Greg Greiner, I think he's still the person who is
leading the EDC this year, and try to coordinate more involvement on my part without being the board liaison.

MR. GEORGE: I just have one other comment to make about it and I'll just make the comment and then drop it, okay? Of all of the committees that we're going to, I think that the EDC is probably the most important with us being involved with what's going on in the community and taking the lead there.

We in essence made a profit last year. We made a profit just to cover the expenses of day to day. We didn't make a profit to put in money in the kitty for enhancements next year, whatever it's going to be. So, I think it should be the chairman, but whatever the group wants to do.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Jack, did you have any further discussion on that before we --

MR. GORMAN: Not really. The EDC is important because -- only because the board needs to be aware of what direction they're going.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: I'll certainly make sure that I work closely with Nick and with Greg, but I -- I think that from a logistics standpoint from
what I'm hearing with -- with Jim, it's ideal for
him to be the person at that and at those
meetings.
And I think that there's not as much economic development. I think that other conversations might be able to -- to reach Buzz's goal that he -- that he spoke about, which I agree with him, that we need to be more intimately involved in the EDC as we go forward.

MR. WERTER: Can -- can I ask? Who has been on the EDC representative? Who's been here out of this board?

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: I've been the second --
MR. GEORGE: I was three or four years ago.
MR. WERTER: Three or four. So -- and Carl
can tell you that the EDC is primarily an informational focal point as to what's going on, and it puts people in touch with each other.

It's -- let's call it the Chamber Rotary. You know, you go there and they have guest speakers from different organizations, as you've heard me report in the past. A lot of them relate. Some don't. But it also puts you in touch with the right people.

Like for instance, the last meeting --
gazuntite by the way. It was the last meeting or
the meeting before, the president of the -- and CEOs of the TPC came down to talk and wanted a better relationship with St. Johns County, and I posed to the board what can we do to have a closer relationship with TPC and this airport hopefully before, what is it, May, before the Championship comes back up? But that's the kind of thing that the EDC is most involved in, is focusing us together, you know, for information.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay. With that, Jim and
Carl, both of you will all have been nominated.
Is there a preference -- and -- and also myself, which I have declined the nomination to be their representative, but I certainly do commit to being more intimately involved with the EDC. Is there -- between the two of you, is there a preference of a first and a second?

MR. WERTER: Carl travels.
MR. YOUMAN: Let Jim.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay.
MR. WERTER: I'll be the first.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Let's put that to a vote.
MR. WERTER: This year or last year -- last
year, did we do first and seconds?

MR. WERTER: We did?
MR. YOUMAN: Yes.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Uh-huh. Then for Jim --
let's put it for a vote for Jim to be the primary
and Carl to be the secondary. All in favor, aye?
MR. GEORGE: Aye.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Aye.
MR. GORMAN: Aye.
MR. YOUMAN: Aye.
MR. WERTER: Aye.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Everybody? None opposed?
The motion passes. Okay. The intergovernmental committee, any nominations for that?

MR. GEORGE: I'd like to nominate Jack. Jack
and I seem to be rotating between this thing every other year, and it's your time in the barrel. I nominated you for chairman of that board again, though.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Jack?
MR. GORMAN: I'll accept that. My work situation's changed, so I have more time. I just went to the last one, and I have an amusing set of notes on that, but they do need to be covered, only because at times --

MR. GORMAN: -- really, at times, you can get, again, direction as to where these different government entities are going. And other times, you're going to need their help.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Oh, yeah.
MR. GORMAN: You're going to need to be able to tackle them.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Oh, yeah. I agree with
you. Do we have any other nominations on the intergovernmental committee?
(No further nominations.)
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: With Jack being the primary, then for a secondary, Buzz?

MR. GEORGE: I'll be the secondary, yeah.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay. Do we have any further nominations as we go forward?
(No further nominations.)
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: All in favor of Jack being the primary and Buzz being the secondary then, say aye.

MR. GEORGE: Aye.
MR. GORMAN: Aye.
MR. YOUMAN: Aye.
MR. WERTER: Aye.

## Opposed?

(No opposition.)
MR. GORMAN: I'll accept it.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay. Thank you. And the
St. Johns County Aerospace Academy. Do we have someone who's interested in being the primary on that?

MR. WERTER: I don't know if you would decline this one. You just seem to be the most involved with -- with the education system all together. You're always there whatever the event.

MR. GEORGE: Based on the previous comments of the board, I would have a problem if she accepted.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: I wouldn't accept it. I wouldn't accept the primary, but I certainly will do my best to attend all the functions there. Do we have anybody else who -- who would be interested or any other nominations for the primary on the Aerospace Academy? Buzz, would you be interested?

MR. GEORGE: No. Carl, how about you? This thing is just taking off. You know, it's going to be with us for a long time. I'm not going to be
with us for a long time. You are. You've got
another three years to go.
MR. YOUMAN: Yeah. I'll take the primary. I need a secondary for sure.

MR. WERTER: I'll be the secondary.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Okay. Do we have any other nominations for a secondary or a primary? (No further nominations.)

MR. YOUMAN: The pay is so high.
MR. GEORGE: I understand they're going to have eggs and bacon.

CHAIRMAN BARRERA: For the -- for the public's edification, all of our -- all of our board member positions are volunteer positions and then as board members, we further volunteer in the community for these committees and for other committees and for the different responsibilities that those committees have. So, that is why Carl was making that joke. All in favor of Carl being the primary and Jim being the secondary, say aye.

MR. GEORGE: Aye.
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: Aye.
MR. GORMAN: Aye.
MR. YOUMAN: Aye.
MR. WERTER: Aye.
opposed?
(No opposition.)
CHAIRMAN BARRERA: The motion passes. We'll
put down Carl as the primary and Jim as the secondary.

As -- as we've done through this year, I
would just like to reiterate to the board members
to please contact Cindy or make it known
however -- whichever is the easiest and the best
way if you are not able to make one of your
assigned meetings and your backup isn't able to
make it so one of the other board members can
attend on your behalf. We don't want to have any
of these meetings missed because they are
important to our community and they're also important to this board.

Thank you. And with that, we will call the special meeting to close, and we will close out this meeting of the St. Johns County-St. Augustine

Airport Authority.
