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1	PROCEEDINGS
2	CHAIRMAN COX: Ladies and gentlemen, like to
3	call to order the final public hearing of the
4	2006-2007 annual budget. We have some comments
5	that will be made by the Chair when we get the
6	PowerPoint display up on the screen here. I'll be
7	doing some explanation of some slides we'll see.
8	Beyond that, would like to go into the
9	announcement of the proposed millage rate.
10	MR. WUELLNER: Right.
11	MR. BURNETT: Right.
12	MR. WUELLNER: Throwing me a loop here.
13	CHAIRMAN COX: Do you guys need more time?
14	MR. WUELLNER: No. I just need to find what
15	I've got here. The that will work. Thank you.
16	2 PRESENTATION OF PROPOSED MILLAGE RATE
17	MR. WUELLNER: All right. We'll do it this
18	way: The millage rate announcement would be
19	.20 I turned it off, didn't I?

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- 20 All right. At -- the millage rate as -- as
- 21 tentatively approved at your first budget hearing,
- 22 was .2055 mills, which is identical to the adopted
- rate of the fiscal year 2005-2006, which is last
- 24 year.
- 25 (Whereupon, Mr. Brunson enters the room.)

1	MR. WUELLNER: However, it exceeds the
2	rolled-back rate this year by 19.7552 percent.
3	Rolled-back millage rate would be .1716, if
4	adopted.
5	But the proposed millage rate that was
6	tentatively approved at your first public hearing
7	was .2055.
8	And your first just by order of things,
9	your first substantive issue needs to be the
10	millage rate, not the budget.
11	CHAIRMAN COX: Right.
12	MR. WUELLNER: And you'll need to adopt the
13	millage rate before you can begin discussions on
14	the budget itself. And that will be done by
15	resolution.
16	CHAIRMAN COX: We will stay within those
17	parameters, I guarantee it.
18	MR. WUELLNER: Thank you, sir.
19	2 BOARD COMMENT OF PROPOSED MILLAGE RATE

20	CHAIRMAN COX: Okay. Discussion of millage
21	rate by the Authority? Mr. Gorman, would you like

- to open? No?
- 23 MR. GORMAN: Oh, sure.
- 24 CHAIRMAN COX: Okay.
- 25 MR. GORMAN: As -- as a point of direction

1	and to build our public credibility, I would like
2	to see a reduction, a reduction from the previous
3	year, even if it is a small reduction, as a point
4	of almost honor to the public.
5	I know we have to have reserves. And I know
6	we've got to run the airport. But if an
7	incremental cut, even, at this point, shows our
8	direction.
9	CHAIRMAN COX: Okay. Very good point.
10	Ms. Green?
11	MS. GREEN: I was looking for the in our
12	PowerPoint presentation that was given to us by
13	e-mail, there was a look as to where we, the
14	airport, are comparing with other agencies.
15	CHAIRMAN COX: We're going to go in go
16	ahead and put that up, Ed. I can
17	MS. GREEN: That was significant to me.
18	CHAIRMAN COX: I'll just go ahead and talk
19	about it now because it's

- 20 MR. WUELLNER: It's up.
- 21 CHAIRMAN COX: -- probably a good lead-in.
- 22 These -- these slides actually were made up
- by Mr. George, and he presented a couple of them
- 24 at the last meeting. This first slide indicates a
- 25 percentage of dollar increase from 1999 in St.

1	Johns County as a taxing authority (indicating).
2	Am I not loud enough? Showing from 1999 to
3	2005, and almost 140 percent
4	MR. WUELLNER: Percent increase in the
5	dollars.
6	CHAIRMAN COX: increase in dollars since
7	1999. Next slide, please.
8	This slide indicates the trend that will
9	continue from 2006 on through 2010 (indicating).
10	We come up to 250 percent, almost another 100
11	percent increase in St. Johns County taxing.
12	This slide goes over the St. Johns County,
13	St. Johns School Board, City of St. Augustine, and
14	the Water Management District. And the graph, as
15	you'll see, pretty much follows the trend moving
16	up the scale from 1999 through 2005, and averaging
17	anywhere, you know, from 120 to 140 percent
18	increase in dollars, taxes.
19	Next that's the next slide?

- 20 MR. WUELLNER: This is the next slide.
- 21 MS. GREEN: That's 2010.
- 22 CHAIRMAN COX: Pardon me?
- 23 MS. GREEN: Up to 2010.
- 24 CHAIRMAN COX: Right. And this indicates the
- trend again of percentage of dollars increased

1	through 2010 of all four of the boards indicated,
2	up to 250 percent (indicating). Next slide.
3	This, when we throw in the St. Johns County
4	Airport and it's a very good graph indicating
5	what the airport has done or is doing at this time
6	with an increase of 80 percent as opposed to the
7	140 percent, 120 to 140 percent over the other
8	taxing authorities from 1999 (indicating). And
9	let's go to the next one.
10	This is an indication on our present course
11	what we'd like to see happen (indicating). And
12	what we're working toward is, you see a slight
13	rise here with the Airport Authority, and then
14	at right at 2009 or 2010, we come straight down
15	to zero (indicating), while the other taxing
16	authorities continue to rise on up to 250 percent
17	ad infinitum.
18	So, it's very good look at and a comparison
19	of the table and the taxing authorities within the

- 20 county. Thank you, sir.
- 21 MS. GREEN: And that was my comment, that I
- 22 liked what the airport's been doing in comparison
- 23 to other agencies, how we've kept it low --
- 24 CHAIRMAN COX: Right.
- 25 MS. GREEN: -- yet still maintaining some

1	revenues and capital so that we can get off the
2	tax rolls. So, I am for staying at the millage
3	rate, the 2005-2006 millage rate, the .2055.
4	CHAIRMAN COX: Right. If we if we
5	don't if we don't continue with that, this line
6	here (indicating) will not will continue on up,
7	and we'll be able to compare ourselves with the
8	rest of the taxing authorities in 2010 and having
9	150 percent incline in our tax.
10	At this point, if we if we are able to
11	stay at the .2055, it's going to allow us to get
12	off the tax rolls quicker and I think be have a
13	better fiduciary responsibility to the tax to
14	the taxed public.
15	Any comments? I don't think I goofed up any
16	of your slides there.
17	MR. WUELLNER: Thank you, sir.
18	CHAIRMAN COX: Did you want to add anything
19	in those, Ed?

- 20 MR. WUELLNER: No. You covered -- covered
 21 that part of it. The -22 CHAIRMAN COX: Okay. So, we'll continue
- talking about the discussion on the millage rate.
- 24 MR. BRUNSON: The only --
- 25 CHAIRMAN COX: Mr. Brunson?

1	MR. BRUNSON: The only comment I have, for
2	the last two meetings, I've anguished over this.
3	And last year, for the first vote, I had to on
4	the millage rate, I we voted and was approved
5	to roll back the tax rate.
6	Things change. And I truly believe that
7	we're making good business sense by keeping the
8	millage rate, even though that's real hard for me
9	to do. But I think the main thing is that that
10	where we're going to really get in trouble if we
11	don't really show that we can be self-sufficient
12	and make these funds work for us to make money so
13	we can get off the tax rate tax roll.
14	So, as hard as it is for me to recommend the
15	present millage rate and take the windfall of the
16	tax appraisals being high, that as long as we
17	continue to take this money at my original motion
18	to put it in reserve for things that will make us
19	money

- 20 CHAIRMAN COX: Okay.
- 21 MR. BRUNSON: We might have to use our credit
- 22 line even above that to do certain things.
- 23 CHAIRMAN COX: Very good points.
- 24 MR. BRUNSON: Okay. That's all I have.
- 25 CHAIRMAN COX: Okay. Going along with

1	Mr. Gorman's position on the type of message that
2	we send, I would love to send a message saying
3	that that we are moving down in taxes or that
4	we're not increasing the tax to the public so that
5	they understand that the tax is not increasing.
6	I don't want to do it purely for the sake of
7	being able to say that we reduced taxes, as
8	opposed to having the responsibility to look out
9	into the future and get the airport off the tax
10	rolls if we maintain the standard millage rate.
11	So, my position is, I am I am positively
12	for the .2055 at this at the rate that we have
13	right now.
14	If there's any further discussion from the
15	board, I'm going to open it up to the public,
16	please: Public discussion. Yes, sir.
17	4 PUBLIC COMMENT ON PROPOSED MILLAGE
18	MR. HICKOX: Again, Wayne Hickox, 881 Queen
19	Road. We've had this discussion in the previous

- 20 meeting, but I'd like to point out to you again
- 21 that I'm afraid you're comparing apples to
- 22 oranges.
- 23 While, yes, the -- the population increase in
- 24 St. Johns County does impact the airport, the
- truth of the matter is to compare it to the School

1	Board or the County Commission budget is a little
2	irrational. They deal directly in population
3	increases. And by the way, that also fuels their
4	revenue.
5	The only way you could possibly do that is if
6	you are renting more hangars or your landings or
7	whatever revenue sources you're using for the
8	general public increase accordingly.
9	As far as what you're trying to do, the
10	points you make are very, very good about the
11	pressure's on you, but I think, Randy, it was you
12	who pointed out at the last meeting, cost of
13	concrete is still going up and you still want to
14	build things. You need a moratorium, gentlemen,
15	if you want to achieve what you're trying to
16	achieve in getting off the tax rolls. Thank you.
17	MR. GORMAN: Thank you.
18	CHAIRMAN COX: Any further public comment?
19	Yes, sir.

- 20 MR. YOUMAN: Only comment I have --
- 21 CHAIRMAN COX: State your name, please, if
- 22 you would.
- 23 MR. YOUMAN: Oh, sorry. Carl Youman.
- 24 CHAIRMAN COX: Carl?
- 25 MR. YOUMAN: 132 Turtle Cove Court.

1	CHAIRMAN COX: Thank you very much, sir.
2	MR. YOUMAN: I live right across the way, and
3	I watch planes take off and land every day. I
4	have a little deck up there and watch it.
5	And what I can't understand is the revenues,
6	as I see it, lease income, et cetera, just barely
7	covers the expenses at this point in time.
8	Why not triple the lease income to the people
9	that are using the airport and, you know, get your
10	increased revenues that way? And I can't see,
11	from what I see here, is how you're going to go to
12	zero by 2010 when you need, from what I can see,
13	\$11,383,000 to operate this versus a revenue of
14	\$1,435,000. Something doesn't connect.
15	CHAIRMAN COX: Thank you very much.
16	MR. YOUMAN: Thank you.
17	CHAIRMAN COX: Further public comment?
18	(No further public comment.)
19	CHAIRMAN COX: Not seeing any further public

- 20 comment, we'll move to the adoption of the millage
- 21 rate. And I'm open for a -- any motion.
- 22 5. ADOPTION OF MILLAGE RATE
- 23 MS. GREEN: I make a motion to accept
- 24 Resolution 2006-06 for the adoption of the millage
- 25 rate at .2055.

1	MR. WUELLNER: Could we read that into the
2	record?
3	CHAIRMAN COX: Pardon me?
4	MR. WUELLNER: Could we read those
5	CHAIRMAN COX: Go ahead.
6	MR. BURNETT: I'll read the resolution into
7	the record. It's Resolution 2000 or would be
8	2006-06.
9	A RESOLUTION OF THE ST. AUGUSTINE-ST. JOHNS
10	COUNTY AIRPORT AUTHORITY OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY,
11	FLORIDA, ADOPTING THE FINAL LEVYING OF AD VALOREM
12	TAXES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2006-07; AND PROVIDING FOR
13	AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
14	WHEREAS, the St. Augustine-St. Johns County
15	Airport Authority of St. Johns County, Florida, on
16	September 18th, 2006, adopted for Fiscal Year
17	2006-07 a Final Millage Rate following a public
18	hearing as required by Florida Statute 200.065;
19	and

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- 21 Airport Authority of St. Johns County, Florida had
- 22 a public hearing as required by Florida Statute
- 23 2000 -- excuse me, 200.065; and
- 24 WHEREAS, the St. Augustine-St. Johns County
- 25 Airport Authority proposed a millage rate of

1	0.2055 mills which is identical with the adopted
2	rate for the prior Fiscal Year of 2005-06;
3	WHEREAS, the proposed millage rate of 0.2055
4	exceeds the rolled-back rate by 19.7552 percent.
5	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the
6	St. Augustine-St. Johns County Airport Authority
7	of St. Johns County, Florida, that the Fiscal Year
8	2006-07 operating millage rate is 0.2055 mills
9	which exceeds the rolled-back rate of 0.1716 mills
10	by 19.75552 (sic) percent.
11	THIS RESOLUTION shall take effect immediately
12	upon its adoption.
13	DULY ADOPTED at a public hearing this 18th
14	day of September, 2006, by its Chairman, attest by
15	its Executive Director.
16	CHAIRMAN COX: All right.
17	MR. BURNETT: That would be the resolution.
18	CHAIRMAN COX: Motion on the table. The
19	resolution's been read. Do I hear a second?

- 20 MR. BRUNSON: I'll second.
- 21 CHAIRMAN COX: Motion on the table and it's
- 22 been seconded. Any discussion?
- 23 (No discussion.)
- 24 CHAIRMAN COX: All those in favor?
- 25 MS. GREEN: Aye.

1	CHAIRMAN COX: Aye.
2	MR. BRUNSON: Aye.
3	CHAIRMAN COX: All those opposed?
4	MR. GORMAN: Nay.
5	CHAIRMAN COX: The ayes win. The millage
6	rate of .2055 is the adopted millage rate.
7	Presentation of proposed budget.
8	6 PRESENTATION OF PROPOSED BUDGET
9	MR. WUELLNER: Okay. Next substantive item
10	on that that you discuss will be the budget.
11	And if you'll allow me, I'll review the budget.
12	And again, please feel free to interject any
13	questions, and we'll do our best to get get
14	some answers that should you have any.
15	(Whereupon, Mr. Burnett leaves the room.)
16	MR. WUELLNER: Otherwise, this is basically
17	the same information that was put forward at your
18	first public hearing last week.
19	The Airport Authority's proposed revenues or

- 20 lease-related revenues of \$1,435,293 projected for
- 21 next year; cash forward of \$721,303; interest
- income of \$40,000; state grant income of
- 23 \$3,602,500; federal grant income of \$3,325,000.
- 24 (Whereupon, Mr. Burnett enters the room.)
- 25 MR. WUELLNER: Ad valorem proceeds, based on

1	the .2055 mills, of \$4,456,000, leading to a total
2	revenue budget as as forecast for fiscal year
3	2006-07 of \$13,580,096.
4	Against an expenditure budget, major
5	classifications of which are salaries or personnel
6	expenditures, which include taxes and statutory
7	requirements, as well as benefits of \$694,799;
8	operating expenditures totaling \$1,191,000; and
9	debt service of zero; reserves of \$1,167,897;
10	equipment capital expenditure of \$325,700; and a
11	construction expenditure of \$10,200,700, for a
12	total expenditure budget balancing the revenue
13	budget of \$13,580,000 excuse me \$13,580,096.
14	CHAIRMAN COX: Is that it?
15	MR. WUELLNER: Yes, sir.
16	CHAIRMAN COX: All righty. Moving into
17	discussion by the Authority. Mr. Brunson?
18	7 BOARD COMMENT ON PROPOSED BUDGET
19	MR. BRUNSON: I have no comment, because I've

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- 20 been over this and over this and over this. So, I
- 21 have no comment. This is the budget I approved
- the last two times.
- 23 CHAIRMAN COX: Mr. Gorman?
- 24 MR. GORMAN: I'll keep it brief. I still
- 25 would like to see an independent analysis of -- a

1	comparative analysis for each operational
2	component to see if any belt-tightening is
3	possible.
4	Of course, it's good for us to continue with
5	substansive substantial reductions in in the
6	most onerous costs, like insurance, and see
7	really, that needs to have a lot more work done on
8	it than we have done already.
9	CHAIRMAN COX: Ms. Green?
10	MS. GREEN: I'm the same with Mr. Brunson;
11	we've gone over this and over this, and I I am,
12	even more so looking I'd like to get into, as
13	Mr. Gorman says, looking at self-insured or
14	something to cut the most astronomical budget cost
15	which we have little to no control over, which is
16	insurance.
17	CHAIRMAN COX: Right.
18	MS. GREEN: So, I think we've done what we
19	can. And hopefully with these T-hangars and

- 20 everything getting finished, we'll have some of
- 21 that revenue that there -- the gentleman was
- 22 speaking about, in the future.
- 23 CHAIRMAN COX: My comments mirror yours and
- 24 Mr. Brunson's.
- 25 So, we'll have no further comment from the

1	board. We'll move into public comment on the
2	budget. Any public comment?
3	MR. BRUNSON: Over here.
4	8 PUBLIC COMMENT ON PROPOSED BUDGET
5	CHAIRMAN COX: Yes, sir.
6	MR. JONES: Joe Jones, 4672 Fifth Avenue. I
7	mostly just had a comment about your income you're
8	going to get off of your T-hangars and your
9	commercial hangars. You're showing a 2 percent
10	increase every year on your rent. So, by the time
11	the four years is up, you're really only a
12	difference of a hundred thousand dollars from
13	where you're already at now.
14	So, what are you planning in four years of
15	construction, about 32 T-hangars?
16	MR. WUELLNER: No. There's
17	MR. JONES: And maybe one corporate?
18	MR. WUELLNER: Actually, there's almost 60
19	CHAIRMAN COX: Sixty-two.

- 20 MR. BRUNSON: Sixty-two.
- 21 MR. JONES: Well, the revenue difference is
- 22 only a hundred thousand dollars. That's what I'm
- 23 wondering. From what you're showing.
- 24 MR. WUELLNER: I'm not sure what you're
- looking at.

1	MR. JONES: From where you're at right now
2	today, you're doing a 2 percent increase a year.
3	MR. WUELLNER: Correct.
4	MR. JONES: So, if you do 2 percent from
5	where you're at right now, you'll come up to
6	\$249,000. And four years from now, you're only
7	projecting what, \$223-?
8	MR. WUELLNER: Yeah.
9	MR. JONES: So, it's only like a hundred
10	thousand dollars difference, which it should be a
11	lot more.
12	MR. HICKOX: Did you add in the new hangars?
13	MR. JONES: That's what I'm saying. In four
14	years no, I'm saying it's only a hundred
15	thousand dollars difference. Sixty hangars should
16	be a lot more than that.
17	MR. WUELLNER: I think it is. I think I
18	think you're going to find it is.
19	MR. JONES: And the same thing with the

- 20 conventional hangars. When you put the 2 percent
- 21 increase in there, you're not really that far off
- from where you're at.
- 23 CHAIRMAN COX: So -- but -- but you have a
- 24 question about it or you just --
- 25 MR. JONES: Well, yeah. It just seems like

1	how many hangars are you actually building in four
2	years? Is it 60 or is it 30 from what you have
3	now? Or the same thing with you know, with the
4	commercial hangars; by the time you do the 8, 9,
5	and 10 in four years, you ain't that far off.
6	You're only like \$30,000 difference when you just
7	put the 8, 9, and 10 income in there.
8	MR. WUELLNER: The 8, 9, and 10 income begins
9	next year.
10	MR. JONES: Right.
11	MR. WUELLNER: At \$52,5-, because it's only a
12	partial year
13	MR. JONES: Right.
14	MR. WUELLNER: that's that's in there.
15	MR. JONES: By the time you go down to year
16	four
17	MR. WUELLNER: By the time I go to year four,
18	I'm at it's at \$126 It's CPI adjustments
19	from that point, or approximate CPI.

- 20 MR. JONES: Right.
- 21 MR. WUELLNER: But each --
- 22 MR. JONES: So, \$123-, and then what are you
- already getting with your conventional hangars?
- Like \$360-, right? Or is it \$322-? Three-sixty
- 25 was with the 10 percent -- 2 percent a year up to

1 the four years.

2	MR. WUELLNER: Well, the corporate or
3	conventional hangar revenues, if you look at the
4	total lines, you'll see it goes from \$357- in
5	revenues to \$600,000 in the in the five-year
6	period. So, it more it almost doubles.
7	MR. JONES: No. Some of them commercial
8	lease now, the lease the commercial leases
9	is the same as your corporate hangars and your
10	MR. WUELLNER: No.
11	MR. JONES: commercial hangars?
12	MR. WUELLNER: That's
13	MR. JONES: That's something different?
14	MR. WUELLNER: It's a different type of lease
15	and they have different types of terms.
16	MR. JONES: Right. That's why I'm asking.
17	Because you seem like you have a big jump every
18	four years in your commercial leases. Is that
19	something just like Grumman paying up something

- 20 every four years or something like that? Because
- 21 every four years, seems like you do a big jump on
- those.
- 23 CHAIRMAN COX: Let me -- let me interrupt.
- 24 MR. JONES: I'm just asking.
- 25 CHAIRMAN COX: We need to -- we need to stick

1	to the 06-07 budget discussion. I'm I'm not
2	trying to cut you off or anything here, but I'm
3	I'm missing any point that you're making for this
4	particular budget discussion.
5	MR. JONES: Well, I'm looking at your whole
6	thing for your budget forecast. You know, to me,
7	it's all one. I mean, if you're
8	CHAIRMAN COX: I understand what
9	MR. JONES: If you're putting money aside
10	CHAIRMAN COX: Well, I'm just I'm
11	looking
12	MR. JONES: to build things
13	CHAIRMAN COX: if you have any input to
14	to develop our
15	MR. JONES: No, I'm just wondering how you
16	come up with it.
17	CHAIRMAN COX: to develop our position on
18	the budget for this particular discussion, that's
19	great. I just I don't want to just sit here

- and beat this up.
- 21 MR. JONES: No, I'm not -- not trying to beat
- 22 nothing.
- 23 CHAIRMAN COX: No, I know.
- 24 MR. WUELLNER: I'll be happy to spend some
- time with you with it, anytime you want to.

1	MR. JONES: That's all. I was just trying to
2	understand
3	CHAIRMAN COX: Thanks a lot.
4	MR. JONES: you put the 2 percent on here.
5	CHAIRMAN COX: Public comment. Yes, ma'am?
6	MS. WILLIS: Mary Willis, Araquay Park. I
7	just have some comments. You're asking the people
8	for \$4,456,000 in taxes. And, of course, the
9	experience is you always get a little bit more
10	than that, because you cannot budget a hundred
11	percent of what you could possibly get. That is
12	almost a million dollars more than last year,
13	\$958,525.
14	As I analyze your budget, the \$4,456,000
15	would cover what you have for actual operating
16	expenses of about \$3 million. So, you're coming
17	out ahead there about one million four, part of
18	which would have to go into capital outlay because
19	your other income would not cover the 10 million

- 20 five that you expect to spend.
- 21 So, you would be building up your reserves,
- and that is part of the point; is that correct?
- 23 CHAIRMAN COX: Yes, ma'am.
- 24 MS. WILLIS: Okay. Thank you.
- 25 CHAIRMAN COX: Absolutely correct. Thank you

1	very much.
1	very muen.

- 2 MS. WILLIS: Sorry about that.
- 3 CHAIRMAN COX: Public comment on this agenda
- 4 item? Any further public comment?
- 5 (No further public comment.)
- 6 CHAIRMAN COX: Seeing no further public
- 7 comment, we will go to the adoption of the budget.
- 8 And I will entertain a motion concerning that.
- 9 9. ADOPTION OF BUDGET
- 10 MS. GREEN: I'll make a motion we adopt
- 11 Staff's recommendation and the budget that we have
- 12 discussed, whatever the resolution number is.
- 13 CHAIRMAN COX: Resolution 2006-07. And if
- 14 the attorney, please, would read that resolution.
